DIVISION I – HORTICULTURE

A BEST OF SHOW CERTIFICATE will be awarded for the Best Horticultural Specimen from Division I, Sections B (Specimen Roses,) N (Novice Exhibitors) and J (Judges Classes.)

The SWEEPSTAKES AWARD (a Traveling Trophy for PPRS members) and ARS certificate will be awarded for the largest number of blue ribbons in Div. I.

SECTION A: SPECIAL CHALLENGE CLASSES

1. ROSE IN A BOWL. Can be any large rose. One bloom, no stem or foliage, 1/2 to 3/4 open, floated in clear water in a clear container to be furnished by the society. ARS Rose Bowl Large Bloom Certificate and Award

2A. MINIATURE ROSE IN A BOWL. Same rules apply as in Class 1, but using a miniature rose. Mini containers are furnished by the society. ARS Rose Bowl Miniature Bloom Certificate and Award

2B. MINIFLORA ROSE IN A BOWL. Same rules apply as in Class 1, but using a miniflora rose. Containers are furnished by the society. ARS Rose Bowl Miniflora Bloom Certificate and Award

3. MOST FRAGRANT. One stem of bloom or blooms of a fragrant rose of any type or variety to be correctly named and displayed in a container furnished by the society. To be scored 80 points for fragrance and 20 points for the overall general condition of the exhibit. ARS Most Fragrant Rose Certificate and Award

4. ENGLISH BOX. Six exhibition-stage blooms of any variety or combination of varieties of large roses correctly named and exhibited in boxes furnished by the society. No foliage is permitted to show. When the quality of the exhibits is close, the arranging of bloom color may be the deciding factor for the judges. Scoring will be based on the ARS point system with the following exception. The 30 points normally allowed for stem, foliage and balance will be awarded to over-all beauty, composition, and excellence of the exhibit. ARS English Box Certificate and Award

5. MINIATURE/MINIFLORA ENGLISH BOX. Six exhibition-stage blooms of any variety or combination of varieties of miniature and/or mini-flora roses correctly named and exhibited in boxes furnished by the society. Other rules as for English Box, above. ARS Miniature English Box Certificate and Award

6. ARTIST'S PALETTE. Seven shrub and/or old garden rose varieties exhibited in an artist's palette provided by the society. No more than two roses of any variety may be included, and foliage is not permitted. The blooms should represent a range of colors as used by an artist. Scored as in Class 4. Award

7. HI-LO. One hybrid tea or grandiflora bloom, and one similar miniature or mini-flora bloom, exhibited in separate containers provided by the society. ARS Hi-Lo Certificate and Award

8. SHRUB BOUQUET. Three to seven different shrub varieties correctly named and exhibited in a single container. May be single blooms, with or without side buds or sprays. Exhibitors may provide their own clear container or use society's. Award

SECTION B: SPECIMEN ROSE CLASSES

Roses will be placed in alphabetical order in each class according to the name of the variety or cultivar. Each separate variety or cultivar will constitute a separate subclass, and a rose or roses entered in this separate subclass will be judged against the standards for that variety. In most cases, an exhibition bloom is considered to be at its most perfect stage of possible beauty when it is from 1/2 to 3/4 open, with the petals symmetrically arranged in an attractive circular outline tending toward a high center. Single and semi-double varieties should be open, with fresh stamens.

1A. HYBRID TEAS, CLIMBING HYBRID TEAS, GRANDIFLORAS.

One bloom per stem with no side buds.

1B. HYBRID TEA SPRAY. Two or more blooms. Award

2. SINGLE AND SEMI-DOUBLE HYBRID TEAS, 5 TO 12 PETALS.

One bloom with no side buds. Award

3. FULLY OPEN HYBRID TEAS.

One bloom with no side buds. Stamens must show.

4. GRANDIFLORA SPRAY. Two or more blooms.

ARS Best Grandiflora Spray Certificate and Award

5. FLORIBUNDAS.

A. One bloom with no side buds.

ARS Best Single Floribunda Certificate and Award

B. Spray, two or more blooms.

ARS Best Floribunda Spray Certificate and Award

6. POLYANTHA SPRAY. Two or more blooms.

ARS Best Polyantha Certificate and Award

7. DOWAGER QUEEN.

VARIETIES INTRODUCED PRIOR TO 1867, INCLUDING ROSES OF UNKNOWN DATES KNOWN TO HAVE BEEN IN EXISTANCE PRIOR TO 1867.

One stem of bloom or blooms, with side buds permitted.

May be exhibited stem-on-stem.

8. VICTORIAN ROSE.

OGR VARIETIES INTRODUCED IN 1867 OR AFTER, OR WITH UNKNOWN DATES OF ORIGIN KNOWN TO BE AFTER 1867.

One stem of bloom or blooms, with side buds permitted.

May be exhibited stem-on-stem.

9. GENESIS AWARD.

Varieties designated as Species (Sp.)

ARS Genesis Award Certificate and Award

10. SHRUBS.

A. CLASSIC SHRUBS. Hybrid Kordesii, Hybrid Moyesii, Hybrid Musk and Hybrid Rugosa. (See the Handbook For Selecting Roses.)

ARS Best Classic Shrub Certificate and Award

B. MODERN SHRUBS. Shrub class (S) as designated in ARS publications.

ARS Best Modern Shrub Certificate and Award

Judges, in addition to the two Shrub certificates, please select Queen, King and princess of Shrubs

11. LATERAL BLOOM SPRAY.

SPECIES ROSES, OLD GARDEN ROSES, OR SHRUBS. ONE CANE WITH LATERAL BLOOM NOT TO EXCEED 30" ABOVE THE NECK OF THE CONTAINER. Award

Judges, please note that, if otherwise eligible, entries in this class may be considered for the following awards: GENESIS, DOWAGER QUEEN, VICTORIAN ROSE AND BEST CLASSIC SHRUB.

12. LARGE-FLOWERED CLIMBERS AND HYBRID WICHURANAS.

One bloom with no side buds or a spray of two or more blooms.

Please note that climbing forms of hybrid teas, grandifloras, floribundas, polyanthas, and miniatures are to be entered in their respective bush-type classes, just as if the word "climbing" did not appear before the classification, unless the climbing hybrid tea has no bush counterpart.

13. MINIATURE ROSES, BUSH AND CLIMBING TYPES.

One bloom with no side buds and displaying exhibition form with stamens not showing and petals unfurling.

ARS Gold Medal Certificate for Miniature Queen of Show, Traveling Trophy and Award.

ARS Silver Medal Certificate for Miniature King of Show, Traveling Trophy and Award.

ARS Bronze Medal Certificate for Miniature Princess of Show, Traveling Trophy and Award.

Court of Honor of five additional blooms of merit. Awards.

14. MINIATURE AND MINIFLORA ROSES, SINGLE AND SEMI-DOUBLE, 5 TO 14 PETALS.

One bloom with no side buds.

ARS Best Single Miniature Certificate and Award

15. FULLY OPEN MINIATURE AND MINIFLORA ROSES.

One bloom per stem, no side buds.

Fully open, double petaled, stamens must show.

ARS Best Fully Open Miniature Certificate and Award

16. MINIATURE ROSE SPRAY. Two or more blooms.

ARS Best Miniature Spray Certificate and Award

17. MINIFLORA ROSES, BUSH AND CLIMBING TYPES.

One bloom with no side buds and displaying exhibition form with stamens not showing and petals unfurling.

ARS Gold Medal Certificate for Miniflora Queen of Show, Traveling Trophy and Award.

ARS Silver Medal Certificate for Miniflora King of Show, Traveling Trophy and Award.

ARS Bronze Medal Certificate for Miniflora Princess of Show, Traveling Trophy and Award.

18. MINIFLORA ROSE SPRAY. Two or more blooms.

ARS Best Miniflora Spray Certificate and Award

19. SEEDLING CLASS. For roses hybridized by the exhibitor.

SECTION J: JUDGES CLASSES

Open only to those Accredited/Apprentice Judges who are judging the show and their immediate families.

- 1. HYBRID TEAS AND GRANDIFLORAS**, Single Bloom.
- 2. FLORIBUNDAS**, Single Bloom.
- 3. HYBRID TEA, GRANDIFLORA, AND FLORIBUNDA** Spray.
- 4. SHRUBS AND CLIMBERS**, Single Bloom or Spray.
- 5. MINIATURES/ MINIFLORAS**, Single Bloom.
- 6. MINIATURES/MINIFLORAS AND POLYANTHA** Spray.
- 7. LATERAL BLOOM SPRAYS AND OLD GARDEN ROSES**
30 inch height rule applies for lateral bloom spray entries.
Side buds permitted on Old Garden Roses.

SECTION D: THE BOUQUET DERBY

Don't throw those duplicate roses away! Arrange them artfully in your own container, and enter the Bouquet Derby. Roses do not have to be named on entry card, although naming is encouraged. Exhibitors may provide their own containers.

Indicate Class 1 for large roses, Class 2 for miniatures.

An award will be given to the best bouquet in each class.

SECTION P: PHOTOGRAPHY CLASSES

Photography Rules:

- Previously exhibited photographs will not be accepted.
 - Photographs must have been taken within the last three years.
 - All photographs, with the exception of the snapshot class, are to be matted.
 - The maximum size of a photograph is 8 x 10 inches, excluding the mat.
 - The roses in the photograph should be named on the entry card if possible, although this will not affect the judging.
 - Photographs may be in black and white or color.
 - A blue ribbon and an award will be given to the best photograph in each class. Red and yellow ribbons will also be awarded.
 - The name of the exhibitor must not appear on the face of the photograph or on its mat. **Presence of a name will cause the entry to be disqualified.**
- One rose as the subject.
 - One rose spray as the subject.
 - A rose garden scene as the subject.
 - An abstracted rose subject, i.e. close-ups of parts of a rose, computer-enhanced rose art, special lens effects, etc.

RULES FOR ROSE SPECIMEN ENTRIES, DIVISION I

1. **Entries will be accepted from 7:30 until 9:30 a.m. Saturday, June 20, 2009. The show will be open to the public from 12:30 PM to 4:30 PM.** No roses, prizes or awards may be removed until after the awards ceremony at the close of the show. This show will be governed by the standard rules and regulations of the American Rose Society. The final authority for a rose show is its own schedule, which should be followed as printed.
2. Competition is open to all rose growers regardless of residence. Exhibitors need not be members of any rose society. All exhibitors must be pre-registered at the classification table, located in the atrium. This is necessary for tabulation purposes.
3. All specimens entered in Division I must have been grown in the exhibitor's private outdoor garden. Only one person or team from any one garden may make an entry in a class. Duplicate entries shall be disqualified.
4. Vases for specimens will be provided in Division I. No foreign materials other than clear plastic wrap or green Styrofoam are to be used as wedging material for rose stems. Discretion in wedging is advised to avoid distraction from the rose. No water-soluble florist's foam is permitted, as it soils the water in the vases.
5. Entry cards are provided by the Society. They should be completely filled out by the exhibitor, attached to vases with rubber bands and left unfolded for classification. Help with rose names is available at the classification table.
6. Classification of roses will be accordance with the latest edition of Modern Roses, the ARS Annual, The Handbook for Selecting Roses, the Combined Rose List or the New Rose Registration listings in the American Rose magazine current to the date of the show. All specimen roses exhibited must be entered under their approved ARS exhibition names. Though not desirable, commonly accepted abbreviations of names are acceptable.
7. The placement of the specimen roses on the show tables will be handled by the placement committee, working from the classification table. No exhibitors, other than those preparing designs or placing challenge class entries, will be allowed on the show floor during placement.
8. Judging will be in accordance with the current edition of the American Rose Society's Guidelines for Judging Roses, and will begin at 10:00. Only judges, clerks and necessary show personnel are permitted in the show area during judging. Decisions of the judges are final.
9. First, second, third, and honorable mention ribbons will be awarded in each class on the basis of quality in the opinion of the judges. Only blue ribbon winners are eligible for trophy awards. No award is required to be awarded for any entry or class.
10. Traveling trophies are the property of the Pikes Peak Rose Society and must be available at next year's show. **Traveling trophies won by non-members or out of town individuals will have the winners' names engraved on them and will be retained by the Pikes Peak Rose Society.**
11. Awards, ribbons, and other properties must be claimed at the close of the show. Exhibitors are to remove their own specimens. Abandoned specimens will be given to the security staff.
12. The Pikes Peak Rose Society and Pike's Peak Community College are not responsible for the loss of personal property or for injury to persons attending the rose show. Liability of all nature is disclaimed.

SCALE OF POINTS FOR HORTICULTURAL SPECIMEN ENTRIES:

FORM, 25 points; COLOR, 20 points; STEM and FOLIAGE, 25 points; SUBSTANCE, 5 points; SIZE, 10 points; BALANCE, 10 points.

The bloom should be symmetrical in form and be typical of its variety. Color and size of the bloom should be typical of its variety. The stem of the rose should be straight and of adequate length to support the bloom. Foliage should be evenly spaced on the stem, be clean and be of good color. Good substance refers to the amount of water in the cells of the petals and foliage; a loss of substance shows in drooping leaflets and petals. **Please check all of your entries to be sure your vases are full of water.**

HORTICULTURE DIVISION DISQUALIFICATION

Horticulture entries can be disqualified for the following reasons:

1. Entry misnamed, unlabeled or mislabeled, or entered in the wrong class. **Judges please note: Although correct spelling is highly encouraged, mis-spelling does not constitute mis-naming or mis-labeling. Corrections may be noted on the back of the entry tag.**
2. Stem-on-stem. A rose may not be exhibited with a portion of the previous stem growth attached. Old garden roses and shrubs are not subject to the stem-on-stem rule. Lateral bloom sprays are also exempt.
3. The presence of foreign material applied to the foliage, stem, or bloom to improve the appearance of the specimen.
4. Not disbudded. Any class calling for one-bloom-per-stem must be exhibited without side buds. A side bud is defined as growth emanating from a leaf axil having sufficient maturity to display the formation of a stem without flowers or buds. The presence of one or more immature leaflets or leaves at the leaf axil with no evidence of a stem is cause for penalization, not disqualification.
5. A specimen in violation of ARS or show rules.
6. A specimen not registered with the ARS.
7. The appearance of the exhibitor's name on any location other than the designated place on the entry tag.
